Phrasal Verb	Meaning	Example Sentence
Check in (for)	Register at a hotel or airport	We need to check in for our flight at least two hours early.
Check out (of)	Depart from a hotel	Let's check out before 11 am to avoid extra charges.
Set off	Begin a journey	They'll set off for the airport at dawn.
Head back	Return to a starting point	We should head back before the gates close.
Drop off	Leave someone at a location	Could you drop me off at the train station?
Pick up	Collect someone from a location	I'll pick you up from the hotel lobby.
Stop over	Have a short stay in between flights	We'll stop over in Dubai for two nights.
Look around	Explore or sightsee	We spent the afternoon looking around the old town.
Check out	Inspect	Don't forget to check out the art gallery I mentioned.
Fill up	Refuel (a vehicle) or eat until full	Let's fill up the tank before the long drive.
Get away	Go on holiday or take a short break	We're planning to get away next weekend.
Come back	Return from holiday	They come back from vacation on Tuesday.
Look forward to	Feel excited about a future event	I'm looking forward to visiting the museum tomorrow.
